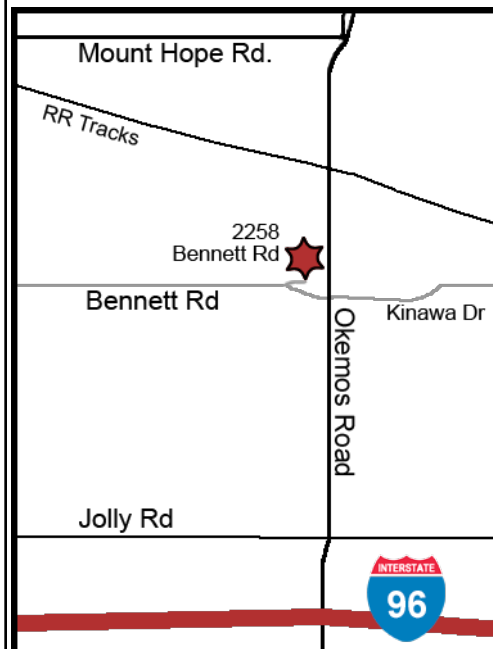

Approximately 70 plants were available for purchase from the estate of Joe Vellanti's wife, Ann. Bill Porter had kindly taken the plants in, treated them with insecticide, watered and fertilized them until they could be dispersed at the meeting. All proceeds were donated to GLOS.

Business

The minutes of the previous general meeting were approved.

Report from the Judging Center: one HCC was awarded to a Paph hybrid. Please note that there will not be a judging session in February in Ann Arbor, but, for one time only, in Cleveland, OH, for a special orchid event at the Cleveland Botanical Garden.

Dot Barnett and Pete Ostlund are display chairs for the Grand Rapids show January 26-27. Plants should be brought to Dot's on Tuesday afternoon or Tuesday or Wednesday evening. Tear-down volunteers: Doris Asher and Kris Garling.

MINUTES OF THE GLOS JAN. 15th BOARD/SHOW CHAIR MEETING - submitted by Ioana Sonea

Meeting held at MSU GLOS show site.

Present: Doris Asher, Dot Barnett, Leslie Behm, Renate De Zacks, Kris Garling, Jim Heilig, Jim Leaman, Marilyn and Hans Lee, Georgia and Brent Marvin, Jerrie Nichols, Peter Ostlund, Pete Porciello, Ioana Sonea, Carol Stuht, Diane Zoellner,

Meeting called to order by Pete Ostlund at 7pm.

Pete Ostlund reported that all vendors have indicated they are coming, with the possible exception of Erich Michel, whose daughter is seriously ill. Orchid societies have been contacted, not all have responded to date.

1. Marilyn Lee and Carol Stuht. Need 8 x 8' tables + 1 round one for Orchids in Art and Orchids in Use exhibits as well as the info table etc. (C. Stuht will confirm number of tables). Clerks: I. Sonea for Orchids in Art exhibit, Ann McConnelee and a guest for Orchids in use.

2. Diane Zoellner re Childrens' corner. Diane will order some supplies, and let the show committee know what worked and what didn't for next year. She will need 4 folding chairs for that area. Ioana Sonea will verify with Dan from MSU that the plants in that area have not been sprayed with any toxic compounds recently.

3. Dot Barnett had nothing to report

4. GLOS exhibit will be set up by Jim Heilig. He is getting new staging, with the help of Sharon Johnson. The staging will be delivered Thursday Feb 21 after 5pm, and setup will happen Friday (Dot, Georgia, Pete O. and Jim H). Orchids for the GLOS exhibit should be dropped off at Jim's house on Wednesday prior to the show, or at the show site on Friday; please e-mail Jim with the names of plants for the exhibit ahead of time. Reminders will be sent out via email 3 and 1 week prior to the show, as well as at the general meeting on Saturday, January 19th.

The staging for the Orchids in Art exhibit will be transported by either Mike Underwood or Jim Leaman (Pete Ostlund will contact).

5. Kris Garling and Leslie Behm for Hospitality. For Friday, pizza from Papa John's, salads and desserts from volunteers (recruiting to be done at the General meeting on Sat Jan 19th). For Saturday, Leslie will bring the popular broccoli & cheese soup, all other items similar to last year.

6. Information table will be manned by Doris Asher (Sunday only), Pete Ostlund, Pete Porciello and Jerrie Nichols, with hopefully the help of additional volunteers (recruited Sat Jan 19th).

7. Doris reported on the status of the Judging: 19 judges and 23 clerks have committed to the show. Ideally would need 30+ clerks.. volunteers to be recruited on Sat Jan 19th.

8. Signage: Ioana Sonea will get permit from MSU once the location of the signs is determined (Note added after meeting: parking will be permitted in lot 46, west of Conservatory, and in lot 54, near Children's Garden. No parking in lot 27, at Vet Med).

9. Advertising: Pete Porciello will use the \$1500 budget for 30 second TV ads (the script is being developed). Doris will contact Channel 10 and local newspapers (LSJ etc). Additional advertising on Facebook should be done, and a YouTube video (or more) should be sought or developed, to post on Facebook.

10. Staging layout, setup: Pete Ostlund and Jim Heilig proposed a new layout for the vendors, which seems to be better use of space. If needed, we can always revert to the previous layout if implementing it proves problematic. Jerrie Nichols and Pete Porciello will mark the floors and make diagrams for vendors on Thursday evening (they will need help). Doris Asher and Jerrie Nichols will check the supply of skirting and topping for the tables, and purchase more if needed. Ioana Sonea will contact A-1 rentals (note: done, tables reserved; all tables are wood-topped and it is OK to staple skirting to them). Jim Heilig, Brent and Georgia Marvin will locate help to setup and take down etc (@ \$10/hr).

Jerrie Nichols will ask for additional help at the Jan 19th meeting, and will borrow cell phones to allow people in the Conservatory to communicate easily with those in the vendor area during setup.

Electricity for displays in hallway between conservatory and vendors area (for Orchids in Art, Orchids in Use, and Owlyn's lighting display) will be available.

11. Topics and speakers for classes are finalized (Jim Leaman).

12. Tear-down on Sunday organized by Brent Marvin.

13. Renate De Zacks will prepare 3-4 corsages for each of the 2 TV stations (Channel 6 on Thursday, Channel 10 on Friday). The flowers have been ordered by Doris Asher and will arrive Wed before the show.

14. Limiting damage to exhibits was discussed: add extra signs, post them prominently, forbid tripods other than during photographers' session 9-11am Sunday; train members to approach public appropriately; periodic announcements over the PA system. Members should wear their name tags.

Meeting adjourned at approximately 8:30pm.

REPORT: GLOS DISPLAY AT MSU -

Once again, members of GLOS came together and put on a great show and a great display! Without your plants, and time, we could not have done it. Our display consisted of around 50 plants in flower, and came in at just under 50 square feet. Dot Potter Barnett and Peter Ostlund very effectively helped arrange the plants-resulting in very nice flow of color while looking very natural. Carol Stuht received the Cymbidium trophy and Dot Potter's Renanthera matutina received the trophy for the Vanda group. A special "thank you" to Sharon Johnson for her masterful woodworking skills, the new wood staging is beautiful!

The effort paid off with the display receiving a blue ribbon for society displays, the trophy for best display as well as the AOS Show Trophy. A pleasant surprise was the 85 point Silver Certificate, which is awarded to a display scoring between 85 and 89 points on a point scale considering aspects of design (35 points possible), quality of flowers (35 points possible), variety (20 points possible) and labeling (10 points possible).

REPORT ON JUDGING GLOS 30th CONSECUTIVE ANNUAL SHOW - submitted by Doris Asher, Chair, Judging Activities

Visitors to our Show enjoyed 23 exhibits. 141 exhibitors entered 574 orchids, exhibits, flower arrangements, and pieces of art in our Show. (These numbers are virtually unchanged from the numbers for our Shows in 2011 and 2012.)

AOS Show Trophy: Greater Lansing Orchid Society

In addition to the above trophies, the 20 judges, who judged our Show this year, selected eleven orchids from the Show to study further and gave American Orchid Society awards to two of them, both owned by Sam Tsui from Orchid Inn LTD, Bloomington, IL:

1. Paphiopedilum Velvet Smile 'Happy Smile' (Big Smile x Velvet Spot) AM/AOS 80 points)

2. Phragmipedium Fritz Schomburg 'Sunset Delight' (kovachii x besseae) HCC/AOS 78 points (Orchid Inn, LTD)

These two hybrids are both slippers, but despite that, they could not be more different. Fritz Schomburg, registered in 2007, is made up of just two species, while Velvet Smile, registered in 2011, is incredibly complex with many generations in its family tree and involves at least thirteen different species in its makeup!

3. Silver Certificate to Greater Lansing Orchid Society exhibit – scored 85 points on 100-point scale

Lynn O'Shaughnessy, who chaired judging on Saturday morning, and I want to thank the people who helped us register all of the entries and prepare the judging folders on Friday night: Ed Cott, Renate de Zacks, Greg Filter, Kris Garling, Jim Heilig, Joe and Joyce Peterson, Sandy Ohlund, and Katie Payeur. In addition, we'd like to thank all of our judges and all of our clerks who came out early Saturday morning despite the weather to help us with the ribbon judging as well as with the AOS judging which followed.

Meeting called to order at 7:15pm by Jerrie Nichols

Show chair's report (Pete Ostlund) The show is coming up in 2 weeks, no pressing issues have surfaced. All but one of the societies that were invited are coming. Members were reminded that help would be greatly appreciated during setup (from Thursday, Feb 21st evening to Friday evening) and take-down (Sunday Feb 24th at 4pm). More clerks on Saturday morning are needed: all volunteers welcome!

Treasurer's report (Doris Asher) covered the period of October 1st, 2012 to February 8th, 2013. The major income for that period arose from show-related income (\$4,380), and the sale or raffle of plants at the November and January general GLOS meetings (\$542). The major expenditures for the same period were also show-related (\$3,494). The net income for the period was \$1,328. Year-to-date, the budget is in positive balance, but the cost of food and table rental for the show has not yet been deducted.

Membership report (Doris Asher): 1 new member since October 2012. Renewals are at 84% of previous membership: GLOS currently has 106 members, distributed in 85 households. Most households (73%) receive the Calypso electronically; the remaining households have contributed towards defraying the cost of mailing the paper copies.
